#### OUR WORK

Across the world, studies show that young adults exiting institutional care are at a higher risk of being exploited, getting trapped in cycles of abuse, or struggling with homelessness and poverty. In the Philippines, thousands of young adults are aging out of institutional care unprepared to transition successfully into a life of independence. We believe the Church is the answer and together as the global body of Christ can stand in the gap to ensure that young adults leaving care are supported and given an opportunity to thrive in independence.

## OUR APPROACH

We believe in 5 core principles to support youth as they move from institutional care into independence.

#### Safe Housing

Housing is one of the most basic human needs. We want our youth to know that they can focus their time and attention on their education and work rather than worry about where they will lay their head that night.

#### Food and basic needs allowance

We ensure that our youth have their basic needs met throughout the month so that they can focus on their education and building a savings account.

#### Academic support/ scholarship

By providing funding for youth to graduate from high school or college, we ensure that youth will have the education needed to obtain employment on their path to independence.

#### Care team


Through a partnership with Generations Home, each youth has an experienced care team behind them to help lead and guide them towards independence.

#### **Spiritual mentorship**

Apart from God, none of this is possible. We work to ensure that youth receive spiritual mentorship to guide them through everyday life.


